Assessment Carcinogenicity

Hydramethylnon has been classified by U.S. EPA as a Group C-possible human carcinogen based on lung tumors observed in mice. Rats treated with hydramethylnon did not show a carcinogenic potential.

DEVELOPMENTAL TOXICITY: Hydramethylnon was not a primary developmental toxicant in rats and rabbits. Developmental effects were observed but were considered secondary to maternal toxicity.

Assessment neurotoxicity Hydramethylnon neurotoxicity studies are not required at this time.

Mutagenicity Hydramethylnon was not mutagenic or genotoxic in a battery of in vitro and in vivo tests.
